or distributed by Long Island women entrepreneurs, including artisans, importers, designers and distributors of products such as jewelry, clothing, fine art, pottery and wood/metal/leather/glassware, children's items, culturally diverse crafts, fiber art, specialty food items, gift baskets, household accessories, paper products and more.

To become exhibitors at the Expo, each participant must submit an application, along with a \$100 application fee and pictures of their work. The Expo Selection Committee reviews all applications, looking for a representative group that reflects a broad range of products that demonstrate quality, uniqueness, a range of prices and product types, and one that showcases the wonderful diversity that has become part of Long Island. The Committee looks for a diverse group of women as well as a diverse selection of products.
